ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION & REPORTING (Eco23)	1/2 DAY

Course Overview

The primary purpose of accident investigation (including RIDDOR) is to identify the cause, in order to suggest remedial action which will prevent a recurrence. This will often involve looking beyond the immediate or direct cause to find the root cause. Only when all of these have been identified and tackled can we claim to have taken effective action. The accident and investigation course gives a basic understanding of RIDDOR (Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations) and the procedures used when discussing improvement of preventive measures in the workplace. Hopefully you will find both the course and its material beneficial in the important work that you perform.

Who Should Attend

This course will be valuable for anyone with responsibility for investigating accidents. The topics covered on this accident investigation training course can be applied to any sector.

This course involves both practical and theoretical sessions. It will focus on:
